As you know, when we think about safety at the workplace we often talk about **proper footwear for the job we are doing**. Please remember that this is just as important in the summer as the winter.

Sandals are not ever the best option in the work place. When feet aren't covered there can be a greater chance of injury. Also, many sandals do not stay on the foot securely. Our Safety Consultant refers to these as "one-ways". That is you should only move forward in them.

In some of our positions workers are prohibited from wearing this type of footwear, such as when weatherizing, cooking and in the classrooms. **We ask all other employees to think about safety when choosing your footwear.**

During the winter months some people's summer footwear has deteriorated. We just had a case of this at the Central Office. This person, who will remain anonymous, had the soles of her sandals fall off! She worked all day sole less! This anonymous person provided the photos below.
