Retirement Rate Increase

Just a reminder that starting July 1, 2018, the rates for our retirement plans will increase.

The employee share is increasing from 5.95% to 6.29%. The agency share will also go up from 8.93% to 9.44%. It is exciting to see that this will result in a combined contribution of 15.73%. This applies to employees that have matched TSAs.



Firework safety

You may have seen some big tents up in Iowa lately. While the state has legalized firework sales from June 1 – July 8, each city can set their own regulations.

Follow these [tips](#) to stay safe:

- Never relight a “dud” firework. Wait 20 minutes and then soak it in a bucket of water.
- Always have a bucket of water and charged water hose nearby.
- A responsible adult SHOULD ALWAYS supervise all firework activities.
- Never give fireworks to children.
- Dispose of spent fireworks by wetting them down and place in a metal trash can away from any building or combustible materials until the next day.
- Obey all local laws regarding the use of fireworks.
- Contact your local fire chief or city hall for regulations.
