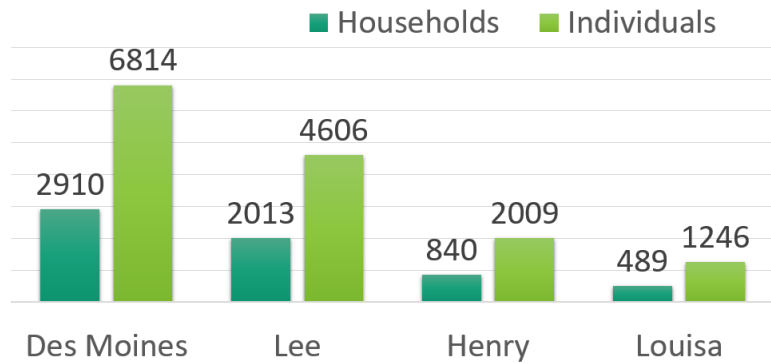


Clients by County Served FY19



Poverty in Southeast Iowa

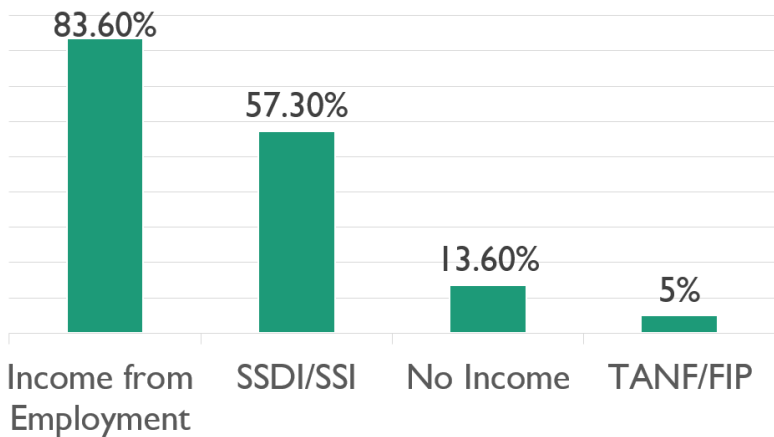
12.95% of the population is below 100% of the Federal poverty level.

The white population is in poverty at a rate of 12.84%, blacks at 49.73% and those of multi-race at 37.87%.

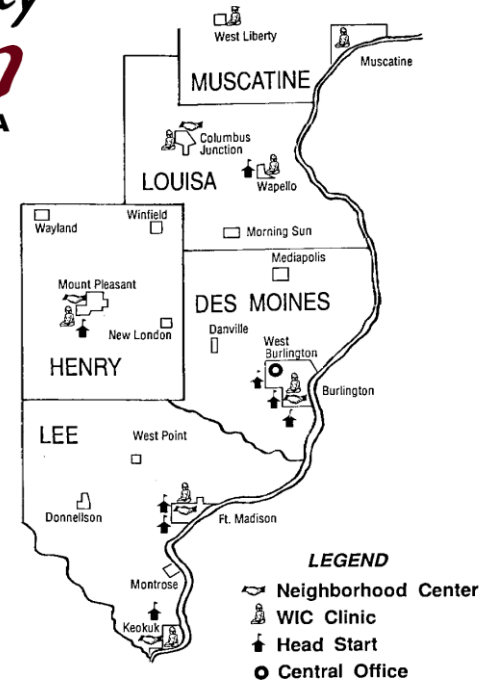
