Community Action of Southeast Iowa is one of 17 Community Action agencies in Iowa. The agency has programs in Des Moines, Henry, Lee, Louisa, and the WIC Program also in Muscatine County.

We are a 501(c)3 nonprofit, not a government agency. Federal funding however, supports many of our programs.

Eligibility for most programs is based on household income. Depending on legislation, some program guidelines can be up to 200% of the federal poverty level.

Policy decisions are made by a board of directors with representatives from our four counties. These include those in government, private groups and people who participate in the programs Community Action provides.

Support from individuals, faith groups, local grants, national and local businesses, and others in the private sector contribute to the success of Community Action.
