Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF)

The Salvation Army provides financial and support services to Veterans and Veteran Families through the Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) Program.

SSVF is a housing stability-focused service delivery program for very low-income Veteran families throughout Central Illinois. This program will serve Veteran families that are homeless or imminently at-risk of being homeless.

The goal is to stabilize these families in housing, while providing on-going support as needed to sustain independent living.

You May Qualify If...

1. You or your spouse are a Veteran
2. You have a very low income that does not exceed 50% of area median income
3. Your housing status is in one of the following three categories:
 - You reside in housing and lack the ability to pay all of your bills
 - You are currently homeless
 - You have left permanent housing within the past 90 days to seek other housing that better meets your family's needs or preferences

Services The Salvation Army may offer include:

- Case Management Services
- Assistance in Obtaining VA Benefits
- Assistance in Obtaining Public Benefits
- Assistance in Securing Permanent Housing
- Rental Deposits
- Utility Deposits
- Time & Amount Limited Rental Assistance
- Time & Amount Limited Utility Assistance
- Amount Limited Moving Costs
- Amount Limited Emergency Supplies
- Transportation Assistance
- Information and Referrals to other Community Resources

There are multiple Salvation Army facilities across central Illinois that provide SSVF services.

What to Bring To Your Intake Meeting at The Salvation Army:

- Your DD214 with discharge status showing on the form
- VA ID card
- Driver's license or state ID (for all adults in the household)
- Social Security card (for all adults and children in the household)
- Verification of income(for all adults and children in the household)
- Lease (if you have housing—must be signed by the landlord & the Veteran)
- If applicable, a letter from the landlord stating the amount of rent arrears—signed & dated, with phone number & address of landlord on the letter
- If applicable, eviction notice or notice to vacate, or a letter from person with whom you are staying that states you must leave
- If applicable, copy of utilities that you need considered for payment
